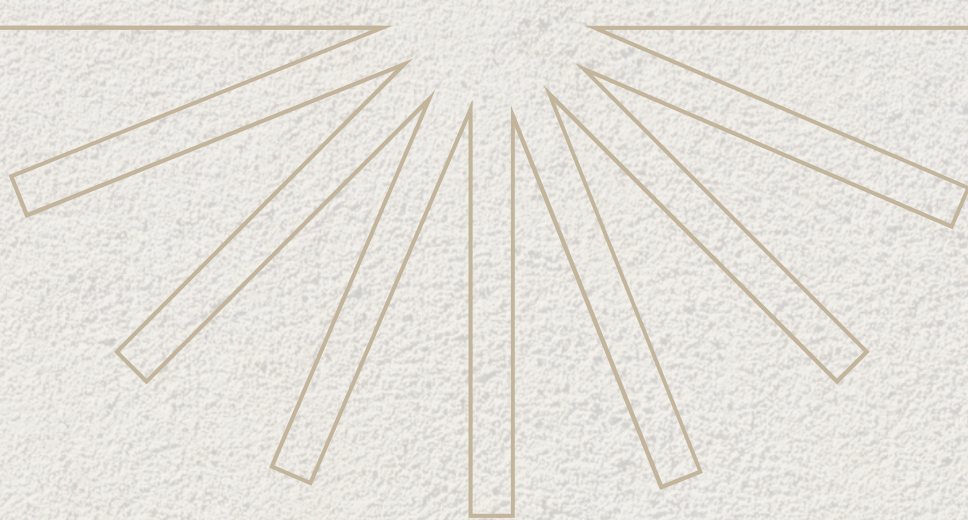


Lindsay Poxon
